

Saying hello in the morning

안녕하세요. 좋은 아침이에요.
An-nyeong-ha-se-yo. Jo-eun a-chim-i-e-yo.

네. 좋은 아침이에요.
Ne. Jo-eun a-chim-i-e-yo.

좋은 = good; 아침 = morning/breakfast; 네 = yes (polite)

Saying hello in the afternoon/evening

안녕하세요. 밥 먹었어요?
An-nyeong-ha-se-yo. bab meo-geo-sseo-yo?

네. (name)씨는 밥 먹었어요?
Ne. (name) ssi-neun bab meo-geo-sseo-yo?

네. 아까 먹었어요.
Ne. A-gga meo-geo-sseo-yo.

밥 = good; 먹다 = to eat; 아까 = earlier
Polite version: 식사 하셨어요? [sik-sa ha-syeot-seo-yo]

Saying hello for the first time!

안녕하세요. 반가워요.
An-nyeong-ha-se-yo. Sik-sa ha-shut-seo-yo?

네. 저도 만나서 반가워요!
Ne. (name) ssi-neun sik-sa ha-shut-seo-yo?

반가워요 = It's a pleasure; 만나다 = to meet; ~도 = also ~

Saying goodbye!

안녕히 가세요!
An-nyeong-ha-se-yo. Sik-sa ha-shut-seo-yo?

네, 안녕히 계세요!
Ne. (name) ssi-neun sik-sa ha-shut-seo-yo?

가다 = to go; 계시다 = to stay (polite)
안녕히 가세요 = when the other person is leaving
안녕히 계세요 = when you are leaving

Saying goodbye!

좋은 하루/밤 되세요!
Jo-eun ha-ru/bam dwe-se-yo.

네, (name)씨도요!
Ne. (name) ssi-do-yo!

하루 = day; 밤 = night; 되다 = to become; ~도 = also ~

식사	sik-sa	meal (polite)

좋은 하루	jo-eun ha-ru	good day
은/는	eun/neun	Topic Marker: Identifies the topic of sentence
